
Who We Are



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Our Care Team

The health care professionals look at the person holistically. The team considers the person's medical history and present health conditions. The team also looks for the effects of past illnesses, as well as 'geriatric syndromes' – common health concerns found in frail elderly such as incontinence, frequent falls, memory problems, and the side effects caused by multiple medications.

The geriatric team may include:

- Geriatricians
- Psychologists
- Social Workers
- Family Physicians
- Dietitians
- Registered Nurses/Registered Practical Nurses
- Pharmacists
- Occupational Therapists
- Spiritual Care Chaplains
- Physiotherapists
- Therapeutic Recreation Specialists
- Speech-Language Pathologists

Medical Stability

Parkwood Institute does not have the medical support necessary to care for patients with acute medical treatment needs. It is therefore very important that patients are medically stable before they are admitted. If this does not happen the patient may have to go to acute care.

Eligibility Criteria

- 65 years of age or over (with the exception of the Musculoskeletal Rehabilitation Unit, which serves adults of all ages)
- residents of Southwestern Ontario (LHIN 1 &
- LHIN 2) depending upon the program
- patient and/or Substitute Decision Maker are aware of referral and have given consent
- family physician (or other MD/NP) referral

Who We Serve

A referral is appropriate when older adults:

- have multiple complex medical, functional and/or psychosocial issues;
- are frail;
- have increased their use of health care services (i.e. multiple emergency room visits).

Driving Assessment - DriveAble is a driving assessment program for medically at risk drivers with cognitive change. The assessment includes cognitive testing and an on road driving examination. DriveAble requires a referral from a physician. Call 519-685-4070 for more information, including the fee.

Our Care Areas

Geriatric Rehabilitation Day Hospital - A day treatment program for clients experiencing functional decline, who live in the community and require rehabilitation. Clients attend 2-3 times per week for a defined period of time.

Geriatric Clinics - We offer multiple outpatient clinics where geriatricians and advanced practice nurses provide assessments and recommendations for clients with complex geriatric issues. Specialty clinics include Aging Brain and Memory Clinic, Continence Clinic and Cognitive Neurology.

Geriatric Rehabilitation Unit - A 30-bed rehabilitation unit for clients with recent functional decline requiring an inpatient stay of 4-6 weeks.

Musculoskeletal Rehabilitaiton Unit - A 20-bed rehabilitation unit for clients requiring an inpatient stay of 3-4 weeks due to functional decline related to orthopedic problems or deconditioning.

Physical Maintenance Program - An ongoing reactivation and exercise program to assist seniors to maintain function. There is a minimal cost per visit.

Regional Geriatric Program Outreach - Clinical assessments are provided in clients' homes throughout Southwestern Ontario.
