<b>A</b>	All activities and procedures/techniques generally performed by physicians or dentists certified in Pathology	Specialty Certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, or an Academic Certificate from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
<b>B</b>	<p>Procedures/techniques requiring the use of specialized equipment and/or training as approved by the Chief of the Department.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Fine needle aspiration biopsy of masses not requiring radiologic or ultrasonic guidance or other specific biopsy procedures.</li> <li>2. At the request of the police, documentation of external trauma (including photography and physical examination) in critically injured patients.</li> <li>3. Needle biopsies of skeletal muscle.</li> </ol>	<p>Certification and Fellowship as indicated in Category A, and additional training as defined and supported by the Chief of the Department.</p> <p>Special competence in Cytopathology</p> <p>Special competence in Forensic Pathology</p> <p>Hands-on training</p>
