Category	Privileges	Educational/Experience Requirements
A	All activities and procedures generally performed by physicians who are certified in Physical medicine & Rehabilitation.	Specialty Certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or an Academic Certificate from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
B	Procedures requiring the use of specialized equipment and/or training as approved by the Chief of the Department including: 1. Electrodiagnostics 2. Spinal and peripheral nerve diagnostics and therapeutic blocks 3. Joint injections, including spinal and 4. Acupuncture	Certification and Fellowship as indicated in Category A, and additional training as defined and supported by the Chief of the Department.
P	Privileges granted to physicians not certified in the specialty who have experience, training and/or demonstrated competence.	Family Medicine Training Program. College Canadian Family Practice. Fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.
