Delineation of Procedural Privileges

Department of Diagnostic Radiology

All members of the Department of Diagnostic Radiology must have their Fellowship in Diagnostic Radiology and accreditation in their appropriate subspecialty where there is an accredited program recognized by the Royal College or the Canadian Association of Radiologists available.

Members of the Department of Radiology have full hospital privileges with no patient admission, except Interventional Radiology, where admitting privileges may be given on request to a radiologist with a significant component of practice in interventional radiology.

B	Procedures requiring the use of specialized equipment and/or training as approved by the Chief of the Department including: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Interventional Spinal Procedures2. Angiography/Interventional3. MRI	Certification and Fellowship as indicated in Category A, and additional training as defined and supported by the Chief of the Department All procedures listed need to have additional fellowship training in the procedural area
C	Privileges granted to physicians not certified in the specialty, but who have experience, training and demonstrated competence.
