Life Experiences in Complex Care, \$3,049 – Parkwood Institute Main Building Patients in the Complex Care Program were able to attend various community outings, while those who were unable to leave were provided with special on-site programs. These activities, made possible through donations to the Therapeutic Recreation Fund, helped to increase socialization, leisure activities and feelings of inclusion for enhanced quality of life experiences.

Palliative Care Redevelopment, \$158,381 – Parkwood Institute Main Building
The expansion and refurbishment of the Palliative Care Unit at Parkwood Institute will include family art walls, sleeper chairs so a loved one can stay overnight, family lounges and additional private rooms to provide a home-like atmosphere where people at the end of life's journey can live, and die, with dignity.

Zero Suicide, \$184,900 – Parkwood Institute Mental Health Building Canada's first Zero Suicide Initiative sets a bold goal of making suicide a never event within our health care system by training and supporting clinical staff to wrap care around people at risk of suicide so that no one falls through gaps in their journey of care.

Veterans Care Transition Project, \$296,229 – Parkwood Institute Main Building

In support of the next phase of transition within the Veterans Care Program to relocate Veterans to one area, funding will be used to install 29 new ceiling lifts, 120 slings, modifications to 2 tub/shower rooms, furniture needs for 2 lounges and accessible bathroom facilities.

Chapel Refurbishment, \$96,324, – St. Joseph's Hospital

The 100-year-old chapel at St. Joseph's Hospital received upgrades for a warmer and more vibrant look that restored the special place of worship to its original glory.
