#### Canada Pension Plan (CPP) Disability Benefits

- Disability benefits for those who cannot work on a regular basis.
- Must have a disability, be under the age of 65, and meet the CPP requirements.

## Home and Vehicle Modification

Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program for Persons with Disabilities (RRAP-D)

- Up to \$60,000 of funding to adjust on-reserve housing for persons with disabilities.
- First Nations and First Nation members can apply.

#### Toyota Mobility Program

- Refund up to \$1,000 of the cost of any adaptive changes on a new Toyota vehicle.
