# What is the Parkinsons Education Program?

This program is aimed to increase awareness and provide coping strategies for individuals with Parkinson's disease and their care partners.

The series provides education delivered by health care professionals on the following topics related to Parkinson's disease:

- Signs and symptoms of Parkinson's disease
- Disease progression and management
- Medication management
- Mobility issues
- Speech and swallowing issues
- Nutrition
- Adaptive equipment for self care
- Energy conservation and relaxation
- Health benefits of leisure
- Overcoming barriers to leisure
- Social and emotional aspects of the disease and adjustment process
- Presentation from Parkinson Society

# In addition, the Parkinsons education

### series offers:

- A health and wellness class for people with Parkinson's disease, led by a physiotherapist
- A workshop for care partners, led by a social worker
- Refreshments during breaks

## Who Should Attend?

The program is intended for individuals living with Parkinson's disease and their caregivers.

#### Other eligibility criteria include:

- Ability to participate in group activities
- Independence with transfers and toileting
- Ability to participate in an exercise class (evaluated on an individual basis)
- Location: Geriatric Day Hospital Parkwood Institute, Main Building 550 Wellington Road London, ON N6C 0A7

#### Parking:

Patients can arrive at the Day Hospital/Ambulance entrance (drop off only, no parking).

Vehicle parking is located at visitor lot 1 for \$5 (cash or credit card) upon entering. Parking rates are subject to change.

If you park in the visitor's lot, enter at the Parkwood Institute Main Building entrance. The Day Hospital is to the left of the lobby.
